CALCULATING OBJECTION AND HEARING DATES FOR MOTIONS FOR RELIEF FROM STAY

- 1. Determine the date that the motion and notice will be filed and mailed.
- 2. Calculate the objection period, which is 14 days from the date the motion and notice are filed.
 - a. If the 14th day falls on a weekend or legal holiday, objections will be due on the following business day.
- 3. Obtain the preliminary hearing date.
 - a. Access the Court's web site at <u>http://www.ilsb.uscourts.gov</u> and select "Hearing Dates" from the menu bar. Ensure the correct selections are made from the three drop down menus. First, select Motions for Relief from Stay. Next, select the case office. Finally, select the case Judge and click "GO."
 - (1) Leave one week between the deadline for objections to the motion and the preliminary hearing date.
 - (2) Select a preliminary hearing date which will be held within 30 days of the motion filing date. In the event a date is not available, contact the Court.

Call the Clerk's Office at (618) 482-9400 for cases starting with a 3 after the year or (618) 435-2200 for cases starting with a 4 or 6 after the year.

(3) When calling for a preliminary hearing date, the bankruptcy case number and the date that the motion and notice will be electronically filed will need to be provided.
